The Supreme Court's decision sends a clear signal that citizens are entitled to religious liberty in their own home. As the Court explained, "Prayer unquestionably constitutes the 'exercise' of religion."

- Maine passed a law that banned families from sending their children to religious schools. This Supreme Court decision held that the exclusion is unconstitutional.
